Which visa option is right for you?

Pacific Engagement Visa

The Pacific Engagement Visa (PEV) is a permanent residence visa for eligible citizens of participating Pacific countries and Timor-Leste.

With this visa, PEV holders can live, work and study anywhere in Australia. There are no restrictions on work location, industry, type of work or employers. Partners also have working rights.

Each program year up to 3,000 visas, inclusive of partners and dependent children, will be allocated to eligible citizens from participating countries through a random ballot process. The number of visas allocated to each country is negotiated between Australia and the governments of participating countries. Those selected in the annual ballot will be able to apply for this visa.

The Australian Government offers a free PEV Support Service in all participating countries. The Service provides a range of in-person and online support throughout the ballot and visa application periods to help people understand the ballot and visa application process, navigate the job application process to meet the employment requirements of the visa, and prepare to settle in Australia.

Falepili Mobility Pathway

The Pacific Engagement Visa (subclass 192) Treaty stream (Tuvalu), known as the Falepili Mobility Pathway, is a special visa arrangement for citizens of Tuvalu under the Australia-Tuvalu Falepili Union Treaty.

The visa gives citizens of Tuvalu the choice to live (temporarily or permanently), work (without restriction),

and study in Australia as permanent residents and provides visa holders the ability to travel to and from Australia.

There will be 280 visas (including partners and dependent children) allocated in the second program year (2026-27) through a random ballot process. Those selected in the ballot will be able to apply for the visa.

The Australian Government offers a free Falepili Mobility Pathway Support Service in Tuvalu and Australia. The Service provides in-person and online support throughout the ballot and visa application process to help Tuvaluans understand the process and prepare to settle in Australia.

Pacific Australia Labour Mobility Scheme

The Pacific Australia Labour Mobility (PALM) scheme is a temporary visa program which enables eligible Australian businesses to hire workers from nine Pacific island countries and Timor-Leste when there are not enough local workers available.

Through the PALM scheme, Pacific and Timor-Leste workers take up a range of short-term (up to 9 months) and long-term job opportunities (one to four years) in low and semi-skilled positions, enabling them to develop skills and send income home to support their families and communities.

PALM scheme workers are required to depart Australia to reconnect with their families and communities. This is for three months following the conclusion of a short-term placement and six months following the conclusion of a long-term placement before they can reapply to re-join the scheme.
